As for why Chris continues to commit to the Fair, he says, "My wife often asks me this question as well as many others; I think the simple answer is I continue to be involved in helping give something back to the community that I live in and that I have raised my kids and now my grandkids in. I think too many today only offer criticism of the world around them while offering no solutions or exerting any energy to create a change. I know this is only a regional fair. Still, we work to provide scholarships for anyone going to college and create an atmosphere where families can come and spend quality time creating memories."

For the 2023 fair, the board is working hard to give back. The board has increased the total dollar amount of available scholarships. Since 1975, the Fair has awarded over one million dollars in scholarships, an achievement the Fair is notably proud of. Lawson adds, "We will have the second annual sensory night, working with community sponsors to set aside time for those with special needs to be able to experience the fair at no cost to those families."
