Hello, everyone!

I'm happy to be able to let you know that we're slowly finding our new normal at Cal Farley's Boys Ranch.



The change started in the spring, when so many of our staff members were able to get vaccinated against COVID. After graduation, we were able to relax our masking protocols, just in time for spring pollen to attack everyone's nasal cavities! More seriously, the ranch has received a lot of rain recently, and the cottonwoods have been producing "cotton" at a prodigious rate. Mike Pacino tells me this year was the third wettest May in Boys Ranch history.

During the 2020-21 school year, 42 residents completed the requirements for high school graduation. That's an amazing accomplishment given the COVID restrictions. I'm so proud of these students for sticking out a challenging year and getting their degrees. Several of them chose midterm graduation, but they have all proven that they are able to see a goal and achieve it.

Of those 42, seven have chosen to Bridge the Gap with us, where they commit to continue living as residents on campus in the summer before leaving for the next chapter of their lives. Bridge the Gap is a unique program among residential childcare facilities in that it allows us to extend just a few extra months of care to those students who need it.

Speaking of care, I want to thank the Alumni Association for being so supportive of these new alumni, who don't really know what the word means yet. Of the recent graduates, 14 are going to live in the Cal Farley's Alumni Support Center while they get their feet under them. Adulthood is hard, and financial support from the Alumni Association for the Alumni Support Center allows us to give our graduates some training wheels. I love how you welcome these residents into the larger Boys Ranch family.

We're going to feature the Cal Farley's Alumni Support Center in an upcoming issue of *The Roundup*, so you'll be able to read more about this wonderful program.

In June, many residents who will be staying with us for the next year spent time with their families during extended home visits, and as I write this, they're starting to return to the ranch. As the children come back, they are quarantining for a few days in their campus homes before rejoining the rest of us. We've admitted some new children, who are also quarantining before entering full campus life. We've been able to offer hospitality this summer to a few local youth groups with trail rides through the property. The groups often dine with us before returning to Amarillo. Between these visitors and the returning residents, more children's voices fill the dining hall every day – a welcome sound after the past year.

In another point of progress, we have launched a new website. It still has the same address, of course – www.calfarley.org – but the new look feels fresher and more user-friendly. This project has been almost six months in the making, and we look forward to hearing what you think of our hard work.

Many of you have been asking, and we're glad to be able to let you know that alumni are welcome again to fish at Boys Ranch. The fish in the ponds haven't seen a lure all winter, and we expect there are some monster trophies lurking in the depths. As always, check in at headquarters when you come to fish, and if you catch a big one, take a picture and share it with us!

Our alumni are always our alumni, and we're always proud of you, too. That's no fish tale!



NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR THE CFBRAA

For months now the BOD of the CFBRAA has been searching for a new Executive Director, following the announcement of Bob's retirement. The BOD elected a Transition Committee to consider all the factors and candidates. Several significant decisions have been made, including electing Sherry Boatwright as the Executive Secretary and employing the services of an outside firm to do the bookkeeping. This last month the BOD voted to accept the recommendation of the committee to a contract with Rick Bousquet, effective July 15TH.

Rick was a Rancher from 1984-88, living in Jim Hill. He worked as a Sgt. with the Texas Prison System and as a Deputy Sheriff for several years before beginning a career in service to non-profit organizations. For the last 20+ years he has served as Executive Director for several non-profit and for profit organizations, including starting a Consulting /Coaching firm specifically to assist Executive Directors and Boards of Directors who manage non-profit organizations. It would be difficult to imagine someone more qualified to lead the CFBRAA at this time. He has a heart for the work we do and for the home from which we all come along with invaluable knowledge and experience in the work we seek to do

Rick's experience in leading organizations such as ours, his passion for what we do, and his experience of being one of us will be a tremendous asset to the CFBRAA. He will lead us to the next level of service and value to both Cal Farley's and all former residents of Boys Ranch and Girlstown.

There will naturally be several changes in the way the CFBRAA does things with a new Executive Director. This includes the appointment of Sherry as the new Executive Secretary. Most communications will be channeled through the secretary. All mail to the Amarillo PO Box will be delivered to Sherry for handling.
