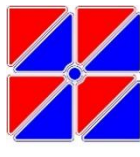
Heifer Show Sunday, September 13, 2026, 9:00am, Miniature Hereford Show followed by Heifer Show, then Steer show

NOTE: There will be only one Heifer Show. We will no longer have B show.

- Livestock Events General Rules & Regulations apply to these shows.
- There will be one show.
 - Exhibitors with multiple entries in one class refer to the General Rules.
 - All Entries are non-refundable.
 - A minimum of six (6) animals of one breed will be eligible for breed champion/reserve money.
- Heifers will be stalled on 2 inches of sand or pellets.
 - No wood shavings are allowed. Only Pellets
- The show order will be as follows:
Miniature Hereford Show - Heifers - Steers - Scholarship Award - Showmanship
- **Heifer Breeds will be shown in the following order:**
Angus
American Breeds – Beefmasters, Braford, Brahmousin, Charbray, Gelbray, Simbrah
Brangus, Brahman, Charolais, Chianina, Hereford, Limousin, Maine-Anjou,
Other registered Breeds, Braunvieh, Gelbvieh, Mainetainer, Percentage Charolais, Percentage Simmental, Pinzgauer, Red Angus, Shorthorn
Red Angus, Santa Gertrudis, Shorthorn, Simmental
- Heifers
 - Heifer show is a Fitted Show
 - Heifer papers must be checked upon arrival or will not be in the show.
 - Heifers must be registered in the name of the exhibitor 30 days prior to the show.
 - Heifers will be shown by breed and age if numbers permit.
 - Six animals are required to have more than one class.
 - Heifers over 24 months of age as of October 1, 2022, are ineligible.
 - Buckles will be awarded to Grand and Reserve Champions, Breed & Reserve Champion will receive Banners

If a re-weigh is requested, the scales will be zeroed, then animal will be re-weighed.
Classes for each breed will be broken by weight into equal numbers as close as possible.

- **After Superintendent has posted the classes, the exhibitor has (1) hour to notify the office of any corrections.**



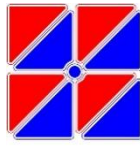
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ANGUS

1. All animals to be eligible to show must be recorded in the American Angus Association Record. Exhibitors must file with the Stock Show Office the name and herd of each animal entered.
2. Only Black Angus are allowed in this show.
3. When any female is shown with a calf at side, the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the calf must be registered by show date and have the original registration certificate at check in.
4. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair); use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances. Exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.
5. DNA marker or blood type for parentage verification – Under Association Rules, each animal for which entry application (registration) is received, may be subjected to a DNA marker type or blood type test to verify ACCURACY OF PARENTAGE as covered under Association Rules. Staff of the American Angus Association must supervise the collection of DNA or blood samples. Animals are often sampled at shows, fairs, or events where the American Angus Association contributes premiums or where Association personnel participate.
6. If a recorded parent is excluded (as a parent) as a result of DNA or blood type, the owner may request, at his own expense, the Association to determine the actual parent. Failure to determine the sire and dam disqualifies the animal's eligibility in the Angus Herd Book and the registration certificate becomes null and void.

AMERICAN REGISTERED BREEDS

1. Open to heifers of Bos indicus type that have been registered or issued a certificate of recordation with a recognized breed association. Ownership MUST be recorded solely in the name of the exhibitor on the registration certificate on or before the October 31 deadline. Breeds defined below are recognized in this division. Any breed not listed below is considered ineligible.
 - Certified Beefmaster E6 – Certified by Beefmaster Breeders United to be at least 50% Beefmaster and can be as much as 100%. At least one of the parents must be registered as a Fullblood Beefmaster.
 - Braford- Purebred, heifers must be classified as "Braford Cow" on registration paper to be eligible to show.
 - Braford F-1- United Braford Breeders registered first generation cross consisting of ½ Brahman—1/2 Hereford blood. No multiple generation half blood or other near-half blood cattle will be accepted. Heifers must be classified as "First Generation" on registration papers to be eligible.
 - Brahmousin- Purebred
 - Brangus Premium Gold- progeny of Registered Brangus or Red Brangus and any commercial animal.
 - Brangus Optimizer- progeny of Registered Brangus or Red Brangus and any other registered animal except Angus and Red Angus.
 - Charbray- Purebred.
 - Gelbray- Purebred.
 - Golden Certified F-1- a female that is the progeny of two registered parents with one parent being registered Brahman resulting in a F1 cross (50% Brahman x 50% Bos Taurus). Animals must be issued a certification of recordation from ABBA which includes owner's name and ownership date.
 - Percentage Simbrah- Heifers must be less than Purebred. Heifers must have evidence of Brahman influence listed on their registration paper to be considered Percentage Simbrah.
 - Simbrah- must be 3/8 Brahman x 5/8 Simmental
 - Star 5- must be 50%-75% Santa Gertrudis blood
 - UltraBlack- progeny of Registered Brangus and Enrolled Angus.



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- UltraRed- progeny of Registered Red Brangus and Enrolled Angus/Red Angus

2. Each animal's tattoos must match the tattoo recorded for that animal in the Herd Book of their respective breed. Any animal not having a legible tattoo or a tattoo not corresponding with its registration certificate will be barred from showing.

BEEFMASTER

1. This Show will abide by the JBBA-Approved Heifer Show rules. Heifers must be registered with the Beefmaster Breeders United (BBU) as a Fullblood and out of a BBU-Certified Fullblood dam, Second Cross dam or as otherwise stated in the BBU By-Laws. Original BBU Certificate of Breeding on each animal, including any calf-at-side, must be presented upon arrival at the Show grounds. Application for a BBU Certificate of Breeding on calves less than 30 days of age will be accepted in lieu of the original certificate. Heifers that do not show the day of month of birth on their BBU Certificates of Breeding shall be born on the first day of that month.

2. Entrants are subject to the Junior Breeders Beefmaster Association, and the Beefmaster Breeders United approved heifer show rules.

3. Animals unethically fitted to alter the conformation or appearance of the animal will be disqualified.

4. Each animal's tattoos must match the tattoo recorded for that animal in the Herd Book of the Beefmaster Breeders United. Any animal not having a legible tattoo or a tattoo not corresponding with its registration certificate will be barred from showing.

BRANGUS

1. To be eligible to show, all animals must be recorded in the International Brangus Breeders Association Record in the name of the exhibitor. RED BRANGUS WELCOMED

2. Breeding animals may not have scurs or any indication of scurs.

3. No animal that shows evidence of brindle may be shown.

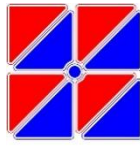
BRAHMAN

1. Animals must be registered in the American Brahman Breeders Association (ABBA) to be eligible to compete. The registration certificates for each entry must be available for presentation to the superintendent or manager of the show at the time entries are verified prior to judging.

CHAROLAIS

2. Animals must be Full blood and registered with the American-International Charolais Association (AICA). Only original certificates of registration will be accepted as evidence of registration and ownership; no photocopies.



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CHIANINA

1. All heifers must be recorded in the Herd Book of the American Chianina Association to be eligible to show. Original Registration Certificates will be checked by the Superintendent during the designated check-in period. No photocopied or faxed certificates will be accepted.
2. All heifers with a registration paper from the American Chianina Association will show as a Chianina regardless of breed percentage.

HEREFORD

1. All Hereford Heifers to be eligible for this show must be recorded in the registry of the American Hereford Association. An official AHA registry number at entry time will be required.
2. This is a combined horned and polled show.

LIMOUSIN

1. All heifers must be recorded in the herd Book of the North American Limousin Foundation to be eligible to show. No photocopied or faxed certificates will be accepted.
2. All orange papered Limousin heifers must be 75% or greater Limousin blood as indicated on the registration certificate issued by the North American Limousin Foundation. Purple paper Lim-Flex cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificates (fullblood, Purebred, Lim-flex and percentage cattle) shall compete in the same classes and championships.

MAINE-ANJOU

1. All heifers must be registered in the American Maine-Anjou Association Record Book and be at least 75% Maine-Anjou to be eligible to show.

OTHER REGISTERED BREEDS

1. Open to heifers of Bos taurus type that have been registered or issued a certificate of recordation with a recognized breed association. Ownership MUST be recorded solely in the name of the exhibitor on the registration certificate on or before the October 31 deadline. Breeds defined below are recognized in this division. Any breed not listed below is considered ineligible.
 - Braunvieh – Heifers that are full-blood or purebred Braunvieh and must be recorded in the herdbook of the BAA
 - Braunvieh Beef Builder- Must meet the Braunvieh Association rules for registrations as a Braunvieh Beef Builder. Eligible animals are at least a ¼ Braunvieh blood and less than purebred Braunvieh.
 - Gelbvieh- Purebred, 75% or greater Gelbvieh blood

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- Gelbvieh Balancer- Must meet the American Gelbvieh Association rules for registration as a Balancer hybrid, 25% to 75% Gelbvieh with the balance Angus and Red Angus.
- MaineTainer- Must be 25% to 62.5% Maine-Anjou
- Percentage Charolais- Must have certificate of recordation with AICA.
- Percentage Simmental- Heifers must be less than purebred.
- Pinzgauer- must be purebred (minimum of 87.5%) or Fullblood (100%)
- Red Angus (Category 1B) – Must have certificate of recordation with RAAA
- Red Angus (Category II) – Must have certificate of recordation with RAAA.
- Red Angus (Category III) – Must have certificate of recordation with RAAA
- Shorthorn Plus- Must be registered as Shorthorn Plus

. RED ANGUS

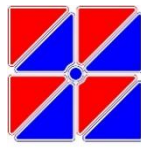
1. Only registered Red Angus of Category IA may be entered in the show.
2. Heifers entered in the show, as well as being registered as a Category IA, must exhibit only English characteristics and features.
3. Smooth poll only, showing no evidence of scurs or “buttons” removed.
4. Heifers may be subject to DNA testing and blood typing to prove parentage and Red Angus/ A status by the Texas Red Angus Association.



1. All exhibits of Santa Gertrudis breeding cattle must meet the requirements for registration as outlined in the Santa Gertrudis Standard of Excellence and shall be governed by the last revised version of the Rules and Regulations for Approved Santa Gertrudis Open & Junior Shows as approved by the board of Santa Gertrudis Breeders International.
2. Exhibitor must be a member in good standing with Santa Gertrudis Breeders International.

SHORTHORN

1. All heifers must be full blood Shorthorn.
2. All heifers must be recorded in the herd Book of the American Shorthorn Association to be eligible to show.
3. Heifer must have legible tattoo, which corresponds to the registration certificate.

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SIMMENTAL

1. Simmental heifers shown in junior breeding classes must be purebred Simmentals and must be registered with the American Simmental/Simbrah Association
