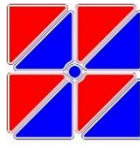
Animals must be in the Barns no later than Friday, September 11, 2026 at 12:00 Midnight

Miniature Hereford Show Sunday, September 13, 2026, 9:00am, followed by Heifer Show, then Steer show

- Livestock Events General Rules & Regulations apply to these shows.
- There will be one show.
 - Exhibitors with multiple entries in one class refer to the General Rules.
 - All Entries are non-refundable.
- Miniature Herefords will be stalled on 2 inches of sand or pellets.
 - No wood shavings are allowed. Only Pellets
- The show order will be as follows:
 - Miniature Hereford Show - Heifers - Steers - Scholarship Award – Showmanship

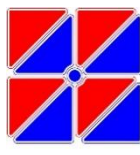

MHBA Junior Show Rules:

1. Exhibitors must be current Miniature Hereford Breeder Association members either under Family or Junior membership.
2. Participants must have reached their 8th birthday on or before show day. Participants must not have reached their 22nd birthday before show day.
3. No participant will be discriminated against due to a physical, emotional or mental disability. The only request is to communicate needed accommodations in advance with the Show Superintendent. Approval will not be given based solely on the age of the exhibitor.
4. Exhibitors name must be listed on the animal's registration certificate as "owner" or "co-owner."
5. The exhibitor listed on the entry will need to be the exhibitor for the show and showmanship.
6. Siblings may not use the same animal in both Pre-Junior and Junior classes.
7. Exhibitors **MUST** exhibit their own animal independently. Only one person (the exhibitor) per animal will be allowed in the ring. Parents, adult or a fellow exhibitor will NOT be allowed in the ring, to assist the junior. Exceptions may apply for exhibitors with reported disabilities only.
8. Exhibitors must show their own animals unless excused by the show superintendent. Only exhibitors who are in attendance but are physically unable to show the animals due to illness or injury will be excused. Exhibitors may at that time secure another Jr. Member to show his/ her animal(s).
9. If an animal is disruptive to its class, it is at the discretion of the show superintendent to dismiss it from that class. Disruptive behavior includes all acts that may cause potential harm to the exhibitor, fellow exhibitors, ring staff, judge, or the animal itself.
10. If an animal gets loose in the show ring, an exhibitor will be given two chances to regain control of said animal throughout the duration of that particular show/class, this includes showmanship. After the third instance exhibitor and animal will be excused from the show ring.
11. Junior exhibitors must adhere to **all** the MHBA Open show rules. See form 1002.
12. If Pre-Junior classes are NOT offered within a Junior Show, then Pre-Junior exhibitors will be permitted to show in the Junior Show classes. Pre-Juniors who are exhibiting in a Junior Show **MUST** adhere to all established MHBA Pre-Junior Show rules as stated in Form 1004, including the mandatory assistant (rule #8). Venue may supersede Pre-Junior rules regarding assistants.
13. All entries (including Cow/Calf pairs) will be measured, with no exceptions. Maximum height allowed to be shown in these classes is 45" on females and 48" on bulls and steers.

14. Effective 2/1/2026, all animals entered in the show must meet the height requirements listed in the official MHBA Age-to-Height Chart below. Measurements are taken at the time of the shows

official heights and measures and must match the animal's age bracket according to the six-month chart. If an animal measures over the maximum height for its age, it will not be eligible to show at the event. However, the animal may qualify to show at future shows if it later falls within the correct height range.

FEMALES	
6 months or younger	40 inches or less
7 to 12 months	42 inches or less
13 to 18 months	44 inches or less
19 to 24 months	45 inches or less

BULLS & STEERS	
6 months or younger	42 inches or less
7 to 12 months	44 inches or less
13 to 18 months	46 inches or less
19 to 36 months	48 inches or less

15. All show cattle must have a DNA profile on file with complete parentage verification (dam and sire verification) with the American Hereford Association before show entry deadline. Steers effective 1/1/2024, Bulls 1/1/2025, Females 1/1/2026.

Junior show divisions:

1. Junior Division (8-11) contestants must be 8 years old on the day of show, and not have reached their 12th birthday by day of show.
2. Intermediate Division (12-15) contestants must be 12 years old on the day of show and not have reached their 16th birthday by day of show.
3. Senior Division (16-21) contestants must be 16 years old on day of show, and not have reached their 22nd birthday by day of show.
